Girl Scout Bronze Award

Prerequisites:

- A registered Girl Scout member at the Junior grade level (4th or 5th grade)
- Completed one Junior grade level Journey

Troop Leader - Girls lead the project with the guidance of the troop leader

Team Members - Can be part of a troop, a small group of girls or an iGirl

Process:

- Watch Bronze Award video or complete the self-study booklet
- Build your Girl Scout team
- Explore your community
- Girls generate a project idea by identifying issues that they personally care about within their community
- Make a plan
- Put your plan in motion
- Spread the word
- Complete Bronze Award report form (each girl must complete)
- Leader reviews and submits completed forms and pin purchase form

Recommended Hours

- 20 hours (if completed as a group, remember to have each member track her specific hours)

Sustainability

- The project makes an improvement within the Girl Scout or local community



Girl Scout Silver Award

Prerequisites:

- A registered Girl Scout member at the Cadette grade level (6th, 7th or 8th grade)
- Completed one Cadette grade level Journey
Check one Journey

 - Breathe
 - MEdia
 - Outdoor Journey
 - Think Like an Engineer
 - Think Like a Programmer
 - Think Like a Citizen Scientist

Troop Leader – Girls begin to take the lead

Team Members – Can work as an individual or as a small group

Process:

- Watch Silver Award video or complete the self-study booklet
- Identify issues you care about
- Build your Silver Award team or decide to go solo
- Explore your community
- Pick your project
- Pick a plan to put your project in motion
- Reflect and share your story
- Complete Girl Scout Silver Award report form, time log and expense sheet (each girl must complete)
- Leader reviews and submits completed forms and pin purchase form

Recommended Hours

- 50 hours (if completed as a group, remember to have each group member track her specific hours for this award)

Sustainability

- Girls plan for sustainability in the project and for implementation within their community



Girl Scout Gold Award

Prerequisites:

- A registered Girl Scout member at the Senior or Ambassador grade level (9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade)
- Earned Silver Award as a Cadette plus one Senior or Ambassador Journey (check one Journey)

OR

- Complete two Senior or Ambassador Journeys

Troop Leader – Individual girl-led project

Team Members – Must be an individual project

Process:

- Complete the Gold Award Training
- Use your values and skills to identify a community issue you care about where you can make a lasting change
- Submit a project proposal to the Council via email or GoGold at least one month before your anticipated project start date. Council staff will notify you of project status. Council approval is required before you can continue working on your project.
- Create a plan and take action
- Educate and inspire
- Once you complete your project, complete Gold Award final report, time log, budget sheet. Submit to the Council for final approval via email or GoGold.
