It is important for your daughter. It teaches her lifelong skills.

She learns about hard work, setting a goal, and working towards it to blow past it! She learns about working with others as part of a team to meet their group goal. She gains confidence by asking people she does not know to buy cookies from her. She learns to look people in the eye and say thank you even when someone does not make a purchase.

She learns to be a better citizen by using cookie sale proceeds to give back to the community and make a difference in your hometown.

**It is important for your troop.** Troops use the proceeds to fund their programming. For many girls, Girl Scouts provides them with their first travel experiences – to a new community, to a new state, and to new countries! One of our Girl Scout troops from Morgantown planned a trip to Greece! Think about those girls and what they have learned about making a decision as a group, setting a goal, and working together to make the trip of a lifetime come true! Without the Girl Scout Cookie Sale Program, these invaluable life lessons may not have been achieved.

**It is important for your community.** Troops also use their proceeds to make a difference right there at home by using proceeds to fund community service projects. Girls decide what projects they want to tackle and they work to make our world a better place! These are some of the ways our girls have helped their own communities and communities around the world:

- Cooked for the homeless shelter
- Made chemotherapy comfort kits
- Stuffed stockings for soldiers
- Made blankets for the children's hospital
- Walked dogs and collected supplies for local animal shelters

Last year, Black Diamond girls provided thousands of hours of community service. Without the Girl Scout Cookie Program, the proceeds to complete these projects would not have been available and the lessons would not have been learned.

## Parent Permission and Responsibility Form for the Cookie Program Sale

I have read the cookie program material and agree that:

- I will adhere to the sale date of the cookie program, January 8, 2021 to February 5, 2021 for pre orders and February 26 - April 11th delivery and cookie booths (to be counted towards the rewards).
- I will accept financial responsibility for all products ordered by my daughter, both pre-orders and re-orders.
- I will not begin taking orders until January 8, 2021. I agree that girl members, with family members serving in a supporting role, will not sell Girl Scout Cookies before this date.
- I will provide my daughter with supervision and adult guidance at all times.

I will be responsible for turning in all money collected for cookies by April 11, 2021 to the troop cookie chair for initial orders and booth sales to date. All remaining money is due by April 30 1, 2021. This is money for booth sales and additional sales.



- I will adhere to the rules governing internet sales.
- I understand that cookies cannot be returned, but boxes that are damaged when I pick them up can be replaced if I contact the Troop Cookie Manager before the end of the sale.

I understand that because unsold cookies cannot be returned, they are the responsibility of the person signing the receipt. I agree to be responsible for the cookies received by my daughter and the money collected by her. I understand that if I do not turn in all the money my daughter owes, or do not adhere to the above list, rewards may be withheld. For any payment or uncollected debt past 90 days of the due date, Black Diamond Council has the right to utilize all necessary means to collect the balance due to the fullest extent of the law.
